CHASING RAINBOWS (Indreni Khojdai Jada) - 2013

This fiction drama centers on the life of three siblings who have migrated to Kathmandu - centre of the Nepali universe. The siblings are young, modern, educated, fun loving, and usually full of life, but with limited access to materialistic privileges. This small budget film abandons cinema's traditional dramatic motifs and uses handheld shots and improvised dialogues successfully blurring the lines of cinema and real life. It is a touching and telling story of youth, family, migration and dreams that get entangled in the urbanized and globalized Kathmandu.

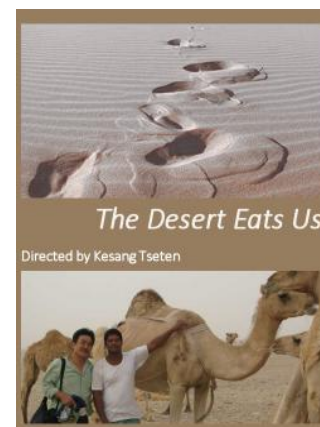
THE DESERT EATS US (2010)

The film provides a rare glimpse of the migrant experience in Qatar, site of the 2022 World Cup where migrants outnumber natives by 3 to 1. Nepali migrant workers' earnings sustain one out of every three households and remittances prop up the country.

While poverty compels Nepalis to sell themselves as cheap labour in the Gulf, it doesn't justify their treatment. Their struggle to endure long working hours in

English – 81mn

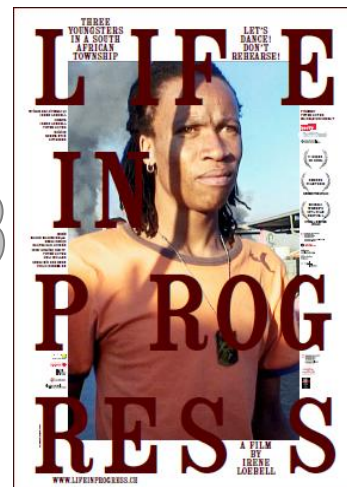

Fatherless and under challenging living conditions, Tshidiso, Venter and Seipati are coming of age in the township Katlehong near Johannesburg. With his dance group TAXIDO, Jerry is keeping the teenagers away from the street. Wherever they perform, they are met with enthusiastic applause.

Suddenly, there is hope of a dance career, of work and of a better future. But back in their shacks the daily struggle and hardship prevails.
